Don't You Worry! Song Lottery (Black Eyed Peas, Shakira & David Guetta)



Description

This STEP-BY-STEP LESSON PLAN for ENGLISH language TEACHING features the song and lyrics for **Don't You Worry** (Black Eyed Peas, Shakira, David Guetta).

Students TALK about buying lottery tickets, WATCH an opinion video in which three people talk about buying lottery tickets and fill a table with information; PLAY a song lottery game with the lyrics; WATCH the lyrics video to check their answers; SPECULATE about the music video and TALK about it.

OBS: This lesson plan was made for **ONLINE TEACHING**, but it can be modified for face-to-face instruction, as well.

Language level: B2/C1

Learner type: All ages

Skills: speaking, reading, listening

Topic: Lottery Games,

Materials: genial.ly presentation, Youtube videos, google forms Song Lottery

Duration: about an hour

STEP-BY-STEP LESSON PLAN

Step 1 (5 min)

Ask your students: Is buying a lottery ticket a good idea?

Do you or your parents play the lottery? Have you ever won anything?

Do you think buying lottery tickets is a good idea? Why (not)?

Step 2 (10 min)

Tell students that they are going to watch a video in which 3 people give their opinion about buying lottery tickets.

Show slide 01 genially presentation ([LINK](#)). Have students copy the table or take a print.

Play the video 2X (or more) ([LINK](#)) and have students write down their answers.

answer key: (also see video script on the last page)

Step 3 (5 min)

Tell your students that they are going to play a “song lottery”! In this lottery, instead of choosing numbers, they are going to choose the words they think the singer will sing. Hand out the song lottery worksheet.

(or share the link to the google forms [LINK](#)) Have students take a print of their results and share with you to see who got more points)

IMPORTANT

If you want to have access to the students' answers, use link below to make a copy of the forms, so you can share your own link with them! ([LINK](#) to make a copy)

Step 4 (7 min)

Give the students some time to choose their ‘winning words’. They should fill out their lottery tickets and cut them out to give you to check the winner (s) of the lottery. You will manually check the answers to see who the winner was (in person), while they watch the lyrics video to check their answers and see how many they got right.

Step 5 (6 min)

After everybody has handed you their tickets (or shared the print of their results from the google forms), play the lyric video ([LINK](#)) and students check if their choices were the right ones. (it's also good for the online students, because they did not get to see the right answers, only the number of points they got).

The winner of the lottery is the one who guessed all the words right! (you can stipulate a prize for the winner eg. a chocolate candy bar, candy, etc. If nobody wins, you can tell them the prize will be accumulated for the next song lottery in one future class!

You can also give the prize to the student who has the most points. It's up to you!

ANSWER KEY (winning words)

1 thumbs 2- flight 3 - life 4 - down 5 - wiser 6 - play 7 - holiday 8 - movin'

Step 6 (7 min)

Have students guess what the music video is like. Have them share their ideas. Then, play the music video for them to check.

Step 7 (7 min)

Have students comment on the video to close the activity.
