



## The Echo of Youth: Younger You (Miley Cyrus) A BEAT+ MUSIC+ Experience

### Description

**The Lesson in Action (Description):** Students read a mysterious letter from the past and hunt for emotional clues before listening to a song to discover the true ending of the story. They analyze Modals of Deduction to make evidence-based guesses about a character's life, debate the emotional cost of success using specific lyric cut-outs as evidence, and finally write an advice text, a voice note, or a letter using the target grammar to resolve the narrative cliffhanger.

**The Song's Narrative (At a Glance):** A younger version of the singer writes a letter to her adult self, asking if she has forgotten what truly matters in life. The adult is now highly successful and famous, but she is overwhelmed, exhausted, and at risk of losing her true identity.

**System Note:** This Guest Pass lesson demonstrates the visible lesson layer of the BEAT+ Method.

### Objectives

- Analyze narrative clues in a prose adaptation to infer a character's emotional state.
- Employ present Modals of Deduction to predict outcomes and make evidence-based guesses about a character's life.

## Step-by-Step Instructions

### Step 1 – The Keyhole Prediction

**Goal:** Trigger curiosity by asking students to guess the relationship between two contrasting figures in an image.

**Text on Screen:** Who are these two people? What is their relationship?

- Ask students to observe the contrasting figures in the slide image.

**Teacher Script:** "**Look at the image on the board.** Who are these two people? (Elicit: [A child and parent / The same person in the past and future])."

**Transition:** "Let's read a mysterious letter sent between these two people."



### Step 2 – The Narrative Immersion

**Goal:** Have students find specific emotional clues hidden in a prose story to build reading comprehension.

**Text on Screen:** THE EVIDENCE HUNT: Read the mysterious letter on your worksheet. Underline exactly 3 clues that show why the adult is currently struggling.

- Distribute the worksheet and have students read the letter independently.

**Teacher Script:** "**(Action: Hand out the Student Worksheet).** Read the letter in Part 1 of your worksheet in silence. Underline exactly three clues that show why the adult is struggling. (Elicit: [Worrying instead, lost touch, busy with your job])."



Transition: "Let's see if you found the correct evidence."

### Step 3 – The Evidence Check

**Goal:** Verify comprehension by revealing the target vocabulary clues on the board.

**Text on Screen:** THE CLUES: "Worrying instead", "Lost touch", "Busy with your job" / "Forget to call"

- Review the underlined clues collaboratively.

**Teacher Script:** "Compare your underlined clues with a partner. Did you find the same evidence? (Elicit: [Yes/No, comparing phrases])."

Transition: "Now, let's use this evidence to solve the mystery of her life."



### Step 4 – The Grammar Vote

**Goal:** Introduce Modals of Deduction as a functional tool for predicting the end of the story based on evidence.

**Text on Screen:** THE MYSTERY: What is the adult's life actually like right now? Vote for your prediction: Option A: She must be very unhappy... Option B: She might be highly successful... Option C: She can't be completely happy...

- Students vote on the predictions using the target modals.

**Teacher Script:** "Look at the Deduction Menu on the board and your worksheet. Based on your clues, vote for Option A, B, or C. (Elicit: [Votes and reasons using 'must be/might be/can't be'])."

Transition: "Let's listen to the actual song to discover the true ending."

### Step 5 – The Musical Reveal

**Goal:** Provide auditory verification of the grammar vote and clarify a key metaphor.

**Text on Screen:** If someone is "standing on the stars," are they ordinary or famous?

- Play the song segment to confirm the narrative outcome.

**Teacher Script:** "Listen to the second half of the song. Which option was correct? (Elicit: [Option B]). Look at the board. If someone is 'standing on the stars,' are they ordinary or famous? (Elicit: [Famous/Successful])."

Transition: "Let's debate what it really means to stand on the stars."

### Step 6 – The Meaning Negotiators

**Goal:** Debate the emotional cost of success using structured roles to ensure the target grammar and lyrics are actively used.

**Text on Screen:** Q1: Is "standing on the stars" a good thing or a tragic thing in this story? ROLES: [🔍] The Word Detective | [🗣️] The Grammar Boss | [🕒] The Time Keeper.

- Divide students into trios for the structured debate.

**Teacher Script:** "(Action: Hand out the separate Lyric Cut-outs). Get into groups of three and choose your role on the worksheet. Discuss the question on the board using evidence from your lyrics. (Elicit: [Debate arguments]). Time Keepers, start the clock."

Transition: "Excellent debate. Let's finish the story in your own words."

### Step 7 – The Epilogue Mission

**Goal:** Generate pushed output by writing a creative response that applies the target grammar and vocabulary to resolve the

cliffhanger.

**Text on Screen:** Choose your mission! 🚩 THE GOLDEN RULE: Whichever project you choose, your output MUST include at least 2 Modals of Deduction AND 2 Vocabulary Clues from the letter.

- Students choose from Option A (Letter Back), B (Voice Note), or C (Advice Text).

**Teacher Script:** "Choose one project from the board. You have 13 minutes. You must use two Modals of Deduction and two vocabulary clues. (Elicit: [Project choices])."

Transition: "Pens down. Let's reflect quietly on your writing."

## Step 8 – The Power of the Pause

**Goal:** Give students a quiet moment to read their work and feel proud of their B1 progression.

**Text on Screen:** Which sentence are you most proud of writing today?

- Silence for metacognitive reflection.

**Teacher Script:** "For the next two minutes, there is zero talking. Read your project. Circle the one sentence that makes you feel the most proud of your English today."

Transition: "[End of Lesson]"

## ANSWER KEY

### 1. THE CLUES (Board Extraction)

- "Worrying instead"
- "Lost touch"
- "Busy with your job" / "Forget to call"

### 2. THE DEDUCTION MENU

**Correct Answer:** Option B

*Context:* The lyric "standing on the stars" confirms her success, while the rest of the song confirms her disconnection and overwhelm.

### 3. SAMPLE PROJECT (Option A)

"Dear Younger Me, I am sorry we **lost touch**. Life **must be** confusing to you looking at me now. I am so **busy with my job** that I barely have time to sleep. I **might be** standing on the stars like we dreamed, but I am **worrying instead** of enjoying it. My life **can't be** like this forever. I promise I will not forget who I am."
